

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF STE. ANNE

BY-LAW NO. 14-1996

BEING A BY-LAW of The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne prohibiting the burning of garbage within the limits of the Unincorporated Village District of Richer

WHEREAS Section 345(1) of The Municipal Act provides in part that the council of any municipality may pass by-laws, not inconsistent with the Public Health or any other Act of the Legislature or of the Parliament of Canada, or with regulations or orders made under any such Act,

(u) generally, for preventing and abating public nuisance that, in the opinion of the council, are detrimental to the health or comfort of the residents of the municipality, and

(v) for providing penalties for the breach of, or other means of enforcing any by-law passed under this section.

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne is of the opinion that burning garbage within the limits of the Unincorporated Village District of Richer is a public nuisance and detrimental to the health or comfort of the residents therein;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne deems it expedient to provide for enforcement of the provisions of this by-law;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED as a by-law of The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne, in Council duly assembled, as follows:

1. This by-law may be referred to as "The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne Garbage Burning By-law";
2. In this by-law
  - a) "council" means the council of The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne;
  - b) "garbage" means animal and vegetable wastes, including food packaging material with residual food materials, resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and serving of foods in households, institutions and commercial concerns, and market wastes, resulting from the handling, storage and selling of foods in wholesale and retail stores and markets;
  - c) "municipality" means The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne;
  - d) "person" means any person, firm or corporation;
3. No person shall burn or cause or permit to be burned, any garbage in barrels or any other receptacles within the limits of the Unincorporated Village District of Richer.
4. Any person who violated, disobeys, refuses or fails to observe, obey or comply with any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offense and is liable upon summary conviction:

4. continued

- a) to a written warning for the first offense;
- b) to a fine of \$50.00 plus applicable costs for a second offense;
- c) to a fine of \$100.00 plus applicable costs for each subsequent offense.

5. All fines and penalties imposed for the violation of any of the provisions hereof and the proceeds of all recognizances extracted in connection therewith shall be paid to The Rural Municipality of Ste. Anne.
