The Provincial Community Planning Branch provided its technical review, noting that the site is located in a high-potential aggregate deposit area, is already an impacted site with several previous quarry dispositions, and is zoned Rural Natural Area, where aggregate extraction is a

conditional use. The review identified no objections from provincial departments, subject to conditions.

Key departmental submissions included:

- Manitoba Agriculture: No concerns; supports extraction with eventual rehabilitation consistent with surrounding soil quality.
- Mines Branch: No objections and supports issuance of the conditional use.
- Water Rights Licensing (MECC): No concerns; applicant must contact the Branch if water use or dewatering is required.
- Transportation & Infrastructure (Highway Design): No objection; requires preliminary traffic projections (aggregate tonnage, truck counts, quarry life expectancy) and may require a Traffic Impact Study.
- Historic Resources Branch: Identified heritage concerns due to a known archaeological site on the quarter section and requires a Heritage Resource Impact Assessment (HRIA) as a condition of approval.

An email from Kevin Medeiros, Operations Manager, confirms he has no objections to the proposed operation, noting that hauling along 45E has been occurring regularly this year and that the proponent uses tandem trucks only.

An email from Chris Wilkins, Fire Chief, confirms he has no objections to the proposed operation.

 - Ensuring adequate insurance coverage, including general and environmental liability.
 - j) Improvement of drainage if deemed necessary by the Municipality.
 - k) Exploration and development of aggregate resources, and the rehabilitation of all sites used in aggregate extraction, shall be undertaken in a manner that is environmentally safe, does not contaminate the groundwater, and is compatible with adjoining lands.
 - I) That the development agreement be reviewed after 15 years.
 - m) That the Applicant provide preliminary traffic projections, including aggregate tonnage, number of trucks and quarry life expectancy to Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure to determine if a more detailed traffic impact study is required.
 - n) That the applicant be responsible for road maintenance and any required repairs resulting from haul route use, as determined by the Municipality.
- 2. That the applicant be responsible for implementing a Heritage Resource Protection Plan for the duration of the resource extraction activities on site and reporting any uncovered historic resources to the provincial department having jurisdiction.
- 3. That the applicant maintain a valid Water Rights License and a drainage plan, if required by the Provincial Drainage Licensing Branch;
- 4. That the aggregate fees be paid in accordance with the Municipality's Aggregate Fees By-Law.
